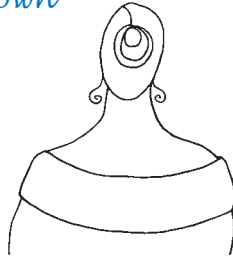


4 Double shoulder drape



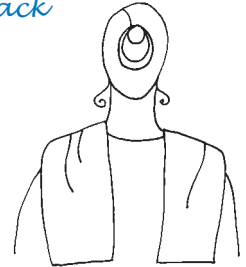
a

No. 3 OBLONG

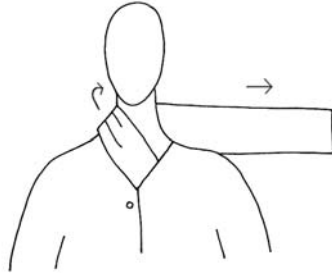


1 Half neck roll



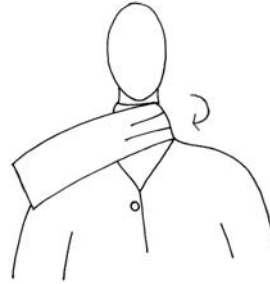
a

tuck one end of your scarf under your collar and take the scarf to the back



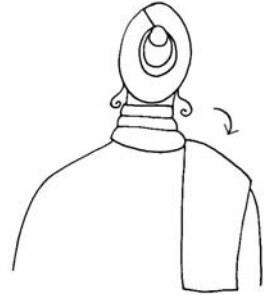
b

roll the scarf around your neck and bring to the front



c

continue to the back again and drape the rest of the scarf over your shoulder

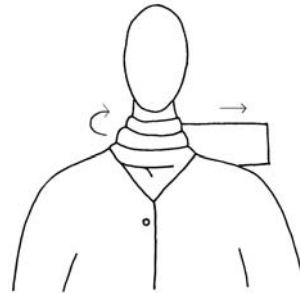


2 Full neck roll



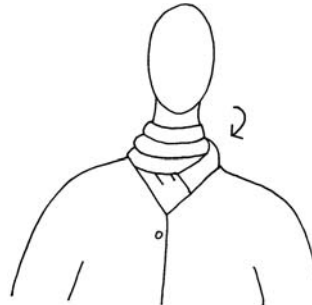
a

tuck your scarf and roll around your neck as in 1a & 1b but continue to roll



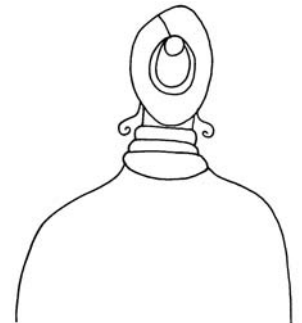
b

tuck the remaining end of your scarf under your collar



c

the finished look from behind

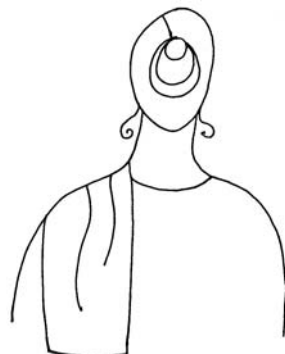


3 Single shoulder drape



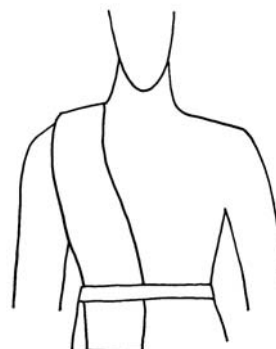
a

drape scarf evenly over one shoulder allowing ends to hang freely front and back



b

you can also secure your scarf under a belt or with a brooch



c

you could also drape the ends from one side to the other and tie or clasp together
